No soap allowed.
- 4—All stock must be bona-fide property of and in possession of the exhibitor six weeks before the Show.
- 5—Cattle belonging or having belonged to stock affected, since Candlemas last, with Pleura Pneumonia or other diseases fatal to cattle, are debarred from competition.
- 6—None of the animals competing to be taken away from the Showground until Exhibition is over.
- 7—No bull above one year old will be permitted to come within the ground set apart for competition unless he is properly secured by a rope fastened to a ring screwed into his nostrils.
- 8—All protests to be lodged in writing with the Secretary before the 25th day of May, 1968. All questions and disputes of any kind that may arise, etc., shall be settled by the Committee whose decision will be final.
